This year during the IARC Day we will recognize and celebrate some truly exceptional achievements in cancer research, namely the identification of human papilloma virus (HPV) as a necessary cause of cervical cancer and the development of a dual strategy to reduce the burden of this cancer by vaccination and by screening. These discoveries will lead to a significant reduction in the current burden of over half a million cases of cervical cancer worldwide, with a vast majority of cases occurring in women in developing countries.

The two recipients of the IARC *Medal of Honour* have made remarkable contributions to this research field. Professor Harald zur Hausen from the German Cancer Research Centre was awarded the Nobel Prize in Medicine in 2008 "for his discovery of human papilloma viruses causing cervical cancer". Professor Nubia Muñoz made major contributions to the establishment of the aetiology of cervical cancer through her pioneering epidemiological studies during her distinguished career as a scientist at IARC.
